## 1) PROSPECTIVE STUDENT CENTER/STUDENT SERVICES

The PSC is your first stop to learn about SDSU and admission requirements. In Student Services, students also take care of important business such as registering for classes, paying registration fees, and signing up for required tests.

### 2 CONRAD PREBYS AZTEC STUDENT UNION

Otherwise known as the Union, the LEED Platinum building houses eateries, Aztec Lanes, the ARC Express, and many other facilities and serves as the hub for campus life. Visit as.sdsu.edu/union to learn more.

### 3) ON-CAMPUS HOUSING (OFF TOUR PATH)

Approximately 8,000 students live on campus. We have 24 residential buildings including traditional residence halls, suites, and apartments, and 22 learning communities.

#### 4 SDSU TRANSIT STATION

Students easily travel to campus using discounted trolley and bus passes. Take the trolley straight from SDSU to football games at Snapdragon Stadium.

## 5) CAL COAST CREDIT UNION OPEN AIR THEATRE

This venue features concerts and popular entertainers under the starry San Diego sky.

### 6) 100 YEARS, 100 STONES MONUMENT

For this monument commemorating SDSU's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary, 100 stones were collected from within a 100 mile radius of SDSU to use in the 100-foot circumference of the design.

#### 7 CALPULLI CENTER

"Calpulli" is the Aztec name for a neighborhood designed to educate, protect, and care. Fitting, since the center serves students' physical and mental health needs.

### 8 VIEJAS ARENA

Students take center court during SDSU basketball games, convocation, and commencement ceremonies held here.

## 9 PARMA PAYNE GOODALL ALUMNI CENTER

#### (ATHLETICS LOOP)

The center provides a home for SDSU's nearly 500,000 alumni.

### 10 AZTEC AQUAPLEX

#### (ATHLETICS LOOP)

SDSU's water polo and swimming and diving teams compete here. Students also take advantage of the San Diego sun with two large outdoor solar-heated pools and a 20-person spa.



### 11) TONY GWYNN STADIUM

(ATHLETICS LOOP)

Recognize the name? Tony Gwynn, the San Diego Padres hall-of-famer and proud SDSU alumnus, was the head baseball coach until his passing

### 12 AZTEC RECREATION CENTER (ARC) (ATHLETICS LOOP)

The ARC has 94,000 square feet of fitness equipment, a track, five fitness studios, Olympic lifting, rock climbing, and much more. Membership is free to enrolled SDSU students with a valid SDSU RedID.

### 13 PERFORMING ARTS DISTRICT

Construction is underway to modernize and expand SDSU's performances spaces, creating two main theatre stages and a world-class sound design lab.

#### 14 SCRIPPS COTTAGE

(SCENIC LOOP)

Surrounded by a green lawn and a fish and turtle pond, this is a tranquil little area on campus for group meetings, poetry readings, and other social events.

### 15 HEPNER HALL

Say cheese! As one of the original campus buildings with its mission-style tower and archways, this is SDSU's most recognized and most photographed location. The bells ring only during Commencement, serving as a rite of passage for graduates.

#### 16 HARDY TOWER

Named after former SDSU President Edward Hardy, the tower originally functioned as an actual water tower. Although it is no longer used to store water, Hardy Tower now houses SDSU's bell chimes, also known as the carillon.

### 17 MEDITERRANEAN GARDEN

Earth's five Mediterranean climate zones, including California's, are represented in the plants found in this serene garden.

## 18 ENGINEERING AND INTERDISCIPLINARY SCIENCES (EIS) COMPLEX

The EIS complex is dedicated to the needs of future scientists, engineers, and entrepreneurs, housing instructional, laboratory, and collaborative spaces.

### 19 SDSU BOOKSTORE

The bookstore sells more than just textbooks you can also find SDSU gifts and clothes, discounted computers, and school supplies. Make sure to get your SDSU gear and show your Aztec pride!

#### 20 UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Enter the dome to find the main intellectual hub on campus. Students study here 24/7 and have access to e-books, special technology, computer programs, special collections, and university archives.
